

Market state in 2014


In opposition to 2013, the cartriges market reflects a strong increase in inkjet and toner bottle while the toner cartridges are steadily declining



Cartridges collected






Evolution by unit and tonnage







Evolution by recycling rates






2014 allowed keeping on improving the user's behavior for used cartridges deposit in shops and outlets, it also improved sorting techniques and treatments and allowed the trade to set realistic goals for the futur:

- keeping or increasing the collection rates
- encouraging more actors to sign the Voluntary Framework Agreement
- anticipating the integration to the WEEE directive in 2018
